



Delivering our Commitments

Once built, Pen y Cymoedd will be the largest onshore wind energy project in England and Wales. The project is located on the Welsh Government's Woodland Estate, which is managed by Natural Resources Wales.



Overview of the construction programme:

February 2014 - 2016: Civil and electrical works, including construction of the site welfare compound, site access tracks, turbine foundations, crane pads, underground cabling, and substation

- Late 2015: Turbine deliveries, civil works continue
- Early 2016: Turbine installation expected to begin
- Late 2016: The wind farm is commissioned
- Early 2017: Project completion



Maximising the value of the project to the local economy



What was done

- Sessions for local businesses with the main contractors
- Requirements written into all contracts to maximise use of local companies and workers
- Regular monitoring across all activities

Project Facts and Figures

- 200 jobs supported during tree clearance phase
- U Grid connection cables will be manufactured in Wales
- Two thirds of workers will be recruited locally
- > £20m invested in Wales through the project in 2013
